We had an amazing experience serving the city of Indianapolis and growing in our own personal relationships with Jesus. This year our group of 17 included 5 first time participants, many mission trip veterans and 2 former students returning as adult leaders. What is it about the mission trip that gets students and adults alike excited to jump in and keep coming back? The structured day you find yourself in while on the mission trip keeps your focus on God continually; it's an experience you want to bring home with you. Each day begins with time for you to be in God's word to get your heart and mind set for whatever the day may bring. Each morning is booked with ways you can jump in and serve those around you. This year there were so many opportunities to be the hands and feet of Jesus. In Indianapolis we were part of meeting the food and clothing needs of many. Not only were we able to meet their immediate physical needs but we were able to tell many we are serving because Jesus Christ served us when he chose to come to earth, die in our place, and now he lives again changing our lives daily. Even our lunch breaks give us an opportunity to tell stories of how God has been using us. Each evening we play together. Each night we worship and read the Bible together. Each day on the mission trip ends with our church group coming together and sharing how we see God working in us and through us and praying for each other. You see on the mission trip the church is able to be a little more of what God designed us to be.

How can we take these scheduled mission trip realities and incorporate them into our everyday life? Mission trip participants this past week have seen the difference beginning and ending your day with truth from God can make. Isaiah 55:11 "So is my word that goes out from my mouth: It will not return to me empty, but will accomplish what I desire and achieve the purpose for which I sent it." Time on the mission trip reminds us how good it is to give. Acts 20:35 "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'" On this mission trip you don't have to make an effort to "do life" with other Christ followers, they are there asking you questions about where you are at with God everyday and people were praying with and for each other all the time. Acts 2:42-43 "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer... All the believers were together and had everything in common." What makes us the church? It is so much more than our building with beautiful stained glass and newly remolded bathrooms. It is the common experience we share that Jesus Christ changed our life and is working in us teaching us how to live. See if you can't add some of these mission trip experiences that heighten our relationship with God for one unforgettable week into your day to day routine. Church, read the Bible alone and together, pray for each other and with each other, meet together to share together often, look for ways to serve -- don't hesitate to jump in and be a part of what God is doing. God has promised us more than we could ask or imagine; stand up and experience his kingdom on earth now!
